WOMAN FOLLOWS
HUSBAND IN DEATH

PRINCETON, N. J., Nov. 3.—William C. Ford, 59 years old, of this place, was found dead in bed Wednesday at his home, 18 Quarry Street. Death was attributed to heart trouble. Shortly after his death was discovered his wife, Laura Ford, 48 years old, who had been ill for some time, died in an adjoining room in the home.

Mr. Ford, who was employed for sometime as watchman at the Nassau Inn, was apparently well when he retired. The Fords are survived by three children, Mrs. Lelia Hoagland, Mrs. Marie Bullock, and a son, David Ford. One granddaughter, Laura Ford, also survives.

Their funeral will be held tomorrow afternoon at 1:45 o'clock from their late home. Services will be conducted in the Bright Hope Baptist Church at 2 o'clock. The Rev. A. S. George and the Rev. J. J. Derrick will officiate. Interment will be in the Princeton Cemetery, under direction of Mather.
